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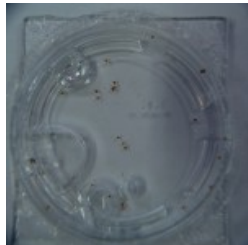
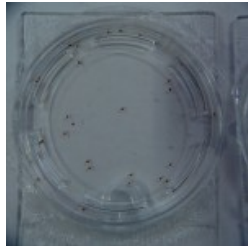
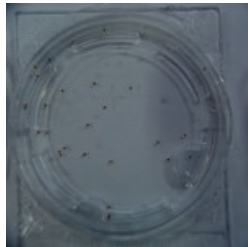
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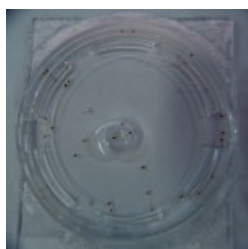
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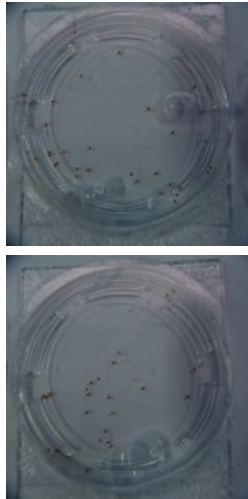
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1 MONTH OLD D2O SAMPLE

- I studied every sample and there is exactly one sprout and it is in the sample that has been in D₂O for over a month. This is due to one of two reasons: 1) It sprouted before addition to D₂O, or 2) there is significant H-D exchange in this sample and the seed eventually sprouted. I'm guessing it is a fluke since there are no other sprouts.
